

# Lorain woman accused of killing two brothers

A Lorain woman surrendered to police at 6 p.m. Thursday, nearly 12 hours after authorities say she shot and killed two brothers on West 23rd Street.

Donna Brown, 24, was charged with murder and felonious assault, said Lorain Police Lt. Mark Carpentiere. More charges are expected to be added later, he said.

Dale Linder, 20, and Justin Linder, 22, were found dead Thursday morning outside their home with single gunshot wounds to the chest.

Police immediately began looking for Brown, warning people she could be armed with a handgun. They had offered \$2,000 for information leading to her arrest.

### Jane Scott memorial unveiled at Rock Hall

"It's only fitting that this beautiful tribute to this amazing lady is now right where she should be, residing with the other greats who represent the pinnacle of that movable feast

and that community that we call rock 'n' roll."

Sculptor David Deming created the statue.

"The hardest part was getting the hair right," said Deming, a fellow graduate of Scott's alma mater, Lakewood High School, and former president of the Cleveland Institute of Art.

The memorial is a gift from Scott's nephew Bill Scott and nieces Linda Scott Cook and Sarah Scott Gooding. They at-

tended the ceremony.

Scott's family also has donated a significant collection of Scott's items to the Rock Hall's Library and Archives, including 4,000 LP records and 300 notebooks.

Scott retired in 2002 after 50 years at The Plain Dealer. She died last year at age 92.
